Events are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. The committee reserves the right to limit entries or cancel any category. Any category with only one entry will be cancelled. If time permits, an exhibition may be offered.

ENTRY FEES

- **\$55.00** – First singles event
(Includes Freeskate, Dance, Create a Skate, Individual Elements)
- **\$30.00** – Each additional singles event
- **\$10.00 per person (individual registration)** – Group Showcase
- **\$10.00 per skater** – Mix & Match Team Elements
- **\$25.00** – CanSkate Elements

Event Limits

- Skaters may enter two events maximum, *in addition to*:
 - Team Elements
 - Killer Killian
 - Family Dutch Waltz
- No Adult categories are offered
- Adults may participate in Family Dutch Waltz only

REFUNDS & WITHDRAWALS

- **Full refunds for:**
 - Cancelled events
 - Withdrawals before registration closes
- **After February 19, 2025:**
 - Refunds only for **medical reasons**
 - Club office must be contacted **before 9:00 AM on April 10, 2026**
 - A **medical certificate** must be provided
- Entries exceeding event limits will be withdrawn and refunded

SKATING UP POLICY

- Skaters may skate up one level (except Group Showcase and Killer Killian)
- Only one event per category may be entered
(e.g., STAR 3 or STAR 4 Freeskate — *not both*)
- Decision to skate up must be made at time of registration

COMPETITION DAY REGISTRATION

- Skaters must check in no later than 1 hour before their scheduled event

- Electronic submission only – No CDs
- Music to be provided if not on Club ipad

OFFICIALS & JUDGING

- Officials assigned by the Competition Chair
- This is a club-level competition intended to be fun and supportive
- There is no guarantee that all Judges and Tech specialists will be fully qualified for all levels
- No video replay

ELIGIBILITY

- Competitors must be home club members of Silver Blades Skating Club
- Showcase: All skaters must meet eligibility requirements
- Family Dance: At least one participant must be a home club member

TEST QUALIFICATIONS

- Qualifications are based on tests **passed as of January 15, 2026**

IMPORTANT

Incomplete entries will NOT be accepted

LIST OF CATEGORIES

CANSKATE - INDIVIDUAL ELEMENTS

In keeping with the Long-Term Athlete Development (LTAD) plan of providing a platform for coaches to encourage and support athletes/participants at every level to fulfill their potential and remain involved in figure skating, this category is focused on the “Learning to Skate” stage.

Eligibility:

- Open to CanSkate Stages 2 - 5
- Intro/Preliminary skaters eligible for Stage 6
- Skaters who have passed any Skate Canada test must enter STAR categories

Helmet Policy:

- CSA-approved hockey helmets **required** for Stages 2–5
- Optional for Stage 6 (no deductions)

Coaches:

- Allowed on ice in designated area
- Must be wearing skates

Skaters may NOT enter CanSkate Elements **and** a Freeskate category.

Stage Requirements

Skaters will be divided into groups and perform the elements. Skaters may NOT enter CanSkate Individual Elements category AND a Freeskate category.

Stage 2 Skaters must have passed the complete Stage 1 badge, but not the complete Stage 2 badge.

- Forward two-foot sculling
- Forward two-foot turn (CW or CCW – skater’s choice)
- Backward two-foot to one-foot glide

Stage 3 Skaters must have passed the complete Stage 2 badge, but not the complete Stage 3 badge.

- Forward circle thrusts (CW or CCW – skater’s choice)
- Backward two-foot jump
- Backward two-foot sculling

Stage 4 Skaters must have passed the complete Stage 3 badge, but not the complete Stage 4 badge.

- Forward one-foot turn (turns are performed on each foot)
- Forward crosscuts (to be performed in each direction)
- Backward circle thrusts or pumps (CW or CCW – skater's choice)
- Two foot jump forwards to backwards and backwards to forwards (CW or CCW – skater's choice)

Stage 5 Skaters must have passed the complete Stage 4 badge, but not the complete Stage 5 badge.

- Forward inside edges
- Forward two-foot side stop (both directions)
- Backward push glide sequence, full length of ice
- Forward power jump

Stage 6 Skaters must have passed the complete Stage 5 badge, but not the complete Stage 6 badge.

- Forward outside edges
- Forward one foot side stop (both feet)
- Forward/backward and backward/forward c-steps
- Backward perimeter skating with crosscuts

Skaters have the option to skate up one level with approval from a CanSkate Coordinator. Judges for this event will not necessarily be Star 1-4 qualified.

STARSKATE CATEGORIES

All STAR events follow the **2025–2026 Skate Canada Competition Program Requirements – STAR**. ([Competition Program Requirements - STAR](#))

Intro/Preliminary skaters should consult their coach regarding:

- CanSkate Stage 6 Elements
- STAR 1 Elements
- STAR 1 Dance
- Team Event

FREESKATE CATEGORIES

- Skaters may enter **only one Freeskate category**

STAR 1–4 Freeskate

(Assessed to Standard / Ranked where applicable)

STAR 1 Elements Assessment

(Assessed to Standard) Must not have passed any part of the STAR 6 Freeskate assessment. Elements scored to standard and skaters may be grouped by age. No Age in restrictions. (Mainly preliminary skaters)

Eight elements include the following:

- Circle Stroking Exercise: Stroking (Crosscuts) in same direction on a circle (one round forward, one round backward); draw for direction
- Waltz Jump
- Single Salchow
- Single Toe Loop
- Forward Upright Spin
- Backward Upright Spin
- Forward Spiral circles: Two Spirals, one on each foot executed on a circle in the same direction; skater chooses direction
- Creative Expression routine (30 seconds – music provided by the Competition Committee, each flight to have a different music selection). This is assessed as “completed” or “incomplete” only

STAR 2 Free Skating Program

Must not have passed any part of the STAR 6 Freeskate Test. Individual elements plus Presentation and Skating Skills assessed to standard. Skaters may be grouped by age. Program Length: 2 minutes 10 seconds maximum. No Age Restrictions. (Mainly Preliminary or Junior skaters)

STAR 3 Free Skating Program

Must not have passed any part of the STAR 6 Freeskate test. One program of 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds). Individual elements plus Presentation and Skating Skills, assessed to standard. Skaters may be grouped by age. No age restrictions. (Mainly Junior skaters)

STAR 4 Free Skating Program

May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 Freeskate test. One program of 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds). Individual elements plus Presentation and Skating Skills assessed to standard and ranked. Skaters may be grouped by age if numbers warrant. (Mainly Junior or Intermediate skaters)

FREESKATE – INDIVIDUAL ELEMENTS

STAR 2 Elements

- Loop Jump
- Waltz Jump + Single Toe Loop
- Back Upright Spin (min. 3 revs)
- Forward Spiral Sequence

Skaters may enter **STAR 2 Elements OR STAR 2 Freeskate — not both**

MIX & MATCH TEAM ELEMENTS

- Teams created randomly by the committee, teams may not have the same number of skaters
- Each skater performs **one element only**
- **No reskates**

The skater qualifications and elements will be as follows:

Star 1 – Waltz Jump

Star 2 – Loop Jump

Star 3 – Loop-loop combination

Star 4 – Axel

Star 5 – Combination Spin – must include at least one camel and one sit position and may include a change of foot. Forward entry only, No flying entry or difficult variations.

Star 6 – Any Double Jump

Star 8 and up – Any combination jump containing at least one double jump.

ICE DANCE CATEGORIES

- Skate Canada Series music used
- Same music for all skaters in a category
- Events may be double-paneled if scheduling allows

Special Events

- **Family Dutch Waltz** – Medals to all participants
- **Killer Killian** – Open to Intermediate & Senior skaters. Skate until you drop!

Solo Dance Categories

The following categories are open to those skaters who do not meet the criteria for the Adult Classifications. Limit to one dance per skater.

Star 1 Dance – Dutch Waltz, skater will not have passed any Star 2 dance test.

Star 2/3 Dance – Baby Blues (2 sequences), skater must have passed the complete Star 1 dance test

Star 4/5 Dance – Swing (2 sequences), skater must have passed the complete Star 3 dance test.

Star 6/7 Dance – Fourteenstep (4 sequences), skater must have passed the complete Star 5 dance test.

Star 8/9 Dance – Tango (2 sequences), skaters must have passed the complete Star 5 dance test.

Star 10/Gold – Quickstep (4 sequences), skater must have passed the complete Star 7 dance test

SHOWCASE & CREATIVE EVENTS

Showcase and creative categories are intended to be entertaining and will be judged on their theatrical and artistic qualities. Programs may tell a story, create a mood or have an obvious theme.

Group Showcase

- 2–6 skaters
- Intermediate/Senior level (based on qualification level at the Fall registration period. Exceptions may be made if a Junior skater is competing at the Star 5 Freeskate level)
- Program length: **1:00 ±10 sec**
- Theatrical costumes & hand props permitted (*no feathers or boas*)

- No lifts, throws, or double jumps (Single jumps permitted)
- Vocal music is permitted
- A maximum of 1 minute will be permitted prior to each performance for the skater(s) to warm-up and set-up any props as necessary
- Programs should not resemble a synchronized skating program; use of team formations and maneuvers should be limited
- Lifts and throws of any kind are not permitted and will be subject to an illegal element violation if included

Create a Skate – Creative Improv

Creative Improv programs are designed only by the skater with minimal preparation. Creative Improv tests the skater's ability to quickly interpret a given piece of music and entertain the audience. Music is selected by the Competition Committee or designate. Skaters will hear the music three times and then will skate a routine of their own creation. Coaches are not allowed to communicate with skaters after the warm-up has begun. Skaters may be grouped by age and/or skating level depending on number of registrants. Music will be 60 seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

- Must have passed STAR 1 Skills
- No coaching permitted
- Music provided by competition committee
- Program length: **60 seconds ±10 sec**
- Components assessed: **Presentation & Skating Skills**
